# **BSW Program Curriculum Revisions**

Effective immediately, the following curriculum revisions are being implemented in the Bachelor of Social Work Program.

These changes will visible in the Bulletin and in DegreeWorks beginning in Fall 2020.

#### **CORE REQUIREMENTS**

## School of Social Work: Foreign Language Requirement

The three-semester "Foreign Language" requirement has been removed.

- BSW Students are no longer required to complete a foreign language through the third level of that language.
- All students are still required to satisfy the <u>Area IV: World Languages & Culture requirement</u> of Core by completing any 9-credit hours (3 courses) of approved courses.
  - To satisfy Core Area IV, we encourage students to either: (a) complete a 3-semester foreign language sequence; or (b) take courses specifically related to cultural competence.

## Major: Biology Requirement

The social work major Biology requirement has been renamed to "Environmental Impact" and expanded to include additional course options.

- BSW students may now complete <u>ONE</u> of the following courses, which part of <u>Area II of Core</u>, as well as UGA's <u>Environmental Awareness Requirement</u>.
  - Area II: Life Science courses:
    - BIOL 1103 / PBIO 1210 Concepts in Biology
    - BIOL 1104 Organismal Biology
    - ECOL 1000 Ecological Basis of Environmental Issues
    - FANR 1100 Natural Resources Conservation
    - FANR(ECOL)(GEOG) 1200 Natural History of Georgia
  - o Area II: Physical Science courses:
    - GEOG 1125 Resources, Society, and the Environment
    - GEOL 1120 Environmental Geoscience
    - CRSS(WASR) 1020 Introduction to Water Resources
- The specified laboratory requirement has been removed.
   (Note: All UGA students are still required to complete a lab course as part of Area II of Core.)

## Major: Abnormal Psychology Requirement

The major Abnormal Psychology requirement has been renamed to "Advanced Social/Psychology Requirement" and expanded to include additional course options.

- BSW students may now complete ONE of the following courses:
  - o PSYC 3230 Abnormal Psychology
  - PSYC 3200 Cultural Psychology
  - PSYC 2101 Psychology of Adjustment
  - SOCI 3270 Personality and Social Structure
  - SOCI 3730 Social Psychology
  - o ECHD 4380/6380 Human Development and Mental Health
  - EPSY 4240 Abnormal Child Psychology

#### Area VI: Statistics Requirement

The Area VI: Statistics requirement has been renamed to "Data and Digital Fluency" and expanded to include additional course options.

- BSW students may now complete <u>ONE</u> of the following courses, which satisfy both <u>Area III</u> and <u>Area VI</u> of Core:
  - ARTS 2100 Strategic Visual Thinking
  - o BIOS 2010 Elementary Biostatistics
  - o CSCI 1210 Computer Modeling and Science
  - o CSCI 1301/L Introduction to Computing and Programming
  - o MATH 1060 Mathematics of Decision Making
  - o PHIL 2500 Symbolic Logic
  - O STAT 2000\* Introductory Statistics (Note: STAT 2000 also satisfies Area I of Core)

#### **BSW PROGRAM PROCEDURES**

## **BSW Application**

BSW students may now apply to the BSW Professional Program in any semester after they have successfully completed SOWK 2154 with a grade of B- or higher. Students must apply and be accepted into the BSW Professional Program prior to enrolling in field work during senior year.

- Admission into the social work major/BSW Professional Program is no longer a prerequisite to enrollment in 5000-level/upper-division SOWK courses.
- Eligibility to apply in a given semester does not mean that they *must* apply that semester.
- A student could apply to the major as early as their second semester enrolled in social work courses, or as late as the summer before beginning senior year.

#### **Upper-Division Coursework Eligibility**

Students who have successfully completed all 2000-level SOWK course requirements are now eligible to enroll in certain 5000-level/upper-division SOWK courses on a space-available basis.

- Upon successful completion of SOWK 2154, SOWK 2154S (or SOWK 2157S), SOWK 2155 and SOWK 2156, students may now enroll in the following courses:
  - SOWK 5326 Foundations of Social Work Research
  - O SOWK 5340 Human Behavior in the Social Environment
  - o SOWK 5390 Introduction to Military Social Work
  - o SOWK 5524 General Practice of Social Work I
  - o SOWK 5701 Social Welfare Policy and Services
  - O SOWK 5757 Current Issues in Social Work I (by permission of instructor)
  - SOWK 5767 Current Issues in Social Work II (by permission of instructor)
- Students may enroll in the above courses even if they have not yet applied/been admitted into the major yet.
- BSW students are no longer required (though they are still allowed) to complete their "senior coursework" in the rigid, two semester sequence of 17-credits each semester.

### School of Social Work GPA Requirement

The School of Social Work minimum overall GPA requirement of 2.5 has been eliminated.

- Students must still maintain a minimum GPA of 2.00 in order to remain in good standing with the university.
- The BSW Program still requires that students in a grade of B- or higher in all SOWK courses.
