MSW Student Practicum Preparation

- Practicum is mandatory and integral to social work education.
- Practicum serves as social work's "signature pedagogy."
- Cultural discomfort may be experienced during the practicum.
- Students are responsible for their transportation to practicum placements.
 - Note: Athens lacks comprehensive public transportation, and placements may be outside the city. Many students rely on ride services or personal vehicles, which may add significant costs to your educational experience

Classroom Preparation

- Class attendance is mandatory, and active participation is expected.
- Punctuality is key; classes begin promptly.
- Respect towards instructors is essential, but engaging in conversation is encouraged. You are not required to agree with everything your teachers may say.
- In class, you are expected to pay attention;
 distractions such as napping, using earphones,
 or attending to phones are discouraged.
- UGA enforces a strict academic honesty policy.
 Assignments must reflect your original work.
- While U.S. peers may offer assistance in adjusting to the U.S. academic system, sharing entire assignments is not permitted.
- Faculty members are accessible via email for appointments and assistance.



Advice & Encouragement

What advice do you have about participating in classes or meeting with professors?

"For meeting with professors always take an appointment and then go to meet with them. Have specific questions prepared so that you can better utilize your time. Initially I struggled to participate in the class discussion and other activities. My advice is to talk to the professor about the challenges you are facing, they will help you to feel integrated in the class. For participating in the class discussion, I used to write down first what I wanted to say and then I used to say it. I was given this advice to write down my thoughts by a professor."

On-Campus Housing

University Housing provides comfortable, affordable, and secure on-campus housing options for students.

Features:

- Furnishings, air conditioning, WiFi, high-speed Internet access, and cable television.
- Common areas include kitchens, laundry rooms, meeting rooms, computer labs, and lounges.

Graduate students should register immediately after their application to the graduate school has been submitted.

"Housing is directly related to transport and one's budget. If you look for a place, it has to have reliable transport and within your budget. Remember to consider whether utilities are inclusive or exclusive of the rent. On campus housing is advantageous as there is a reliable source of transport, however off campus housing gives one freedom. Being in a different environment is mind freeing even if its 15 minutes away from campus. This comes in handy when experiencing expected stress and burn out from school activities.

The leases are usually one year binding, this commitment makes it harder for one to easily change their residence. For both off and on campus, applications should start at least two-three months before expected move in. If off campus, there is an Athens transit bus but slightly limited on weekends."

TransportationSolution

UGA Transportation System

UGA is a large campus, and trying to find your way around can be intimidating at first. The best place to find this information would be to download the UGA app to your phone. This app is feasible for both Apple and Android products. The app provides students with walking directions to buildings, bus routes and stops, and bus schedules. If you have other questions, this link will connect you to the <u>UGA Transportation</u> website.

Athens Public Transit

For students living off-campus or wanting to venture away from campus, public transportation is free to UGA students who present a valid UGA ID. <u>Athens Transit routes</u> all over the city: M-F (6 AM-10 PM) and Sat. & Sun. (7AM - 10PM). Routes can be found on the UGA app.

*Uber and Lyft are ride-share services and can be accessed by downloading their apps. Prices tend to be higher on Saturdays during game days.



Transportation Challenges are Common

While UGA and Athens do offer transportation services, they are insufficient for many students' needs. As a result, transportation can add expensive additional costs and increase your overall educational expenses. Most importantly, the lack of efficient public transportation affects students' transportation to their mandatory practicum placements. Using public transportation (when it's available) may add an hour or more to your commute time; when public transportation is unavailable, using rideshare apps will be a significant expense. Please come prepared to face these challenges.



Some students choose to purchase a car to use while at UGA. Used cars are available. Registration, insurance, and gasoline all add to the expense; also, there is a fee to park on campus.

Transportation to ATL/Airport

Students can take the <u>Megabus</u> from the Athens Multi-Modal Transportation Center to the Civic Center MARTA Station in Atlanta for a nominal fee. Rates vary from \$1-\$20 each way, depending on how far in advance you purchase tickets.

<u>Groome Transportation</u> offers affordable and dependable shuttle service from Athens to the Atlanta Airport. Please check the schedule on their website for cost and departure times. The shuttle leaves from multiple locations in Athens, including the UGA Georgia Center located at 1197 S. Lumpkin St.






UGA Libraries and Technology Support





Helpful Terminology

<u>CHIP</u>- Medicaid and the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) provide no-cost or low-cost health coverage for eligible children in Georgia. These programs provide children with health coverage to get routine check-ups, immunizations, and dental care to keep them healthy.

<u>DFCS</u>- The Department of Family and Children Services in Georgia investigates reports of child abuse; finds foster and adoptive homes for abused and neglected children; issues SNAP, Medicaid, and TANF; helps out-of-work parents get back on their feet; and provides numerous support services and innovative programs to help families in need.

<u>Mandated Reporter</u> – A person required by law to report reasonable suspicions of abuse. This includes physicians, hospitals or medical personnel, dentists, RNs, LPNs, counselors, social workers, school teachers, administrators, guidance counselors, psychologists, child welfare agency personnel, child counseling personnel, law enforcement personnel, and child service organization personnel.

<u>Medicaid</u>-Medicaid is a program that provides health care services to individuals who meet income, resources, and citizenship requirements.

<u>Medicare</u>- a federal health insurance system for people over 65 and certain younger people with disabilities.

<u>Social Security</u> – In the United States, Social Security is the commonly used term for the federal Old Age, Survivors, and Disability Insurance (OASDI) program. It is administered by the Social Security Administration. The original Social Security Act was signed into law by President Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1935, and the current version of the Act, as amended, encompasses several social welfare and social insurance programs.

Social Security is funded primarily through payroll taxes called Federal Insurance Contributions Act tax (FICA) or Self Employed Contributions Act Tax (SECA).

<u>SNAP</u>- The Georgia Food Stamp Program (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) is a federally-funded program that provides monthly benefits to low-income households to help pay for the cost of food. A household may be one (1) person living alone, a family, or several unrelated individuals cohabitating who routinely purchase and prepare meals together.

TANF- Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) is a monthly cash assistance program with an employment services component for low-income families with children under age 18 and children age 18 who are attending school full-time.
