

UNDERGRADUATE CERTIFICATE IN NONPROFIT MANAGEMENT & LEADERSHIP

GUIDELINES FOR UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS

The Undergraduate Certificate in Nonprofit Management and Leadership is designed for students who have aspirations of working in the nonprofit sector. A multidisciplinary faculty of scholars and practitioners who are nonprofit leaders in the Athens community support the program.

ELIGIBILITY

Students who wish to participate in the program must be currently enrolled and in good standing in an undergraduate degree-seeking program, have completed or in progress to complete at least 60 credit hours at time of application, and possess a minimum overall 3.20 GPA.

PROGRAM OF STUDY

Students must successfully complete 12 credit hours of coursework to obtain the certificate. All MNML courses are permission of department. Students will need prior approval before registering.

HOW TO APPLY & DEADLINES

Step 1: Apply for the certificate in Athena.

Step 2: Submit the Application to the Undergraduate Certificate in Nonprofit Management and Leadership.

Applications will be screened by the program office which will indicate whether the application has been approved or denied through Athena. Those meeting the standard requirements will be accepted into the program. If the application is approved, the student will be added to our Certificate Listserv and sent an email containing information about advising and registering for certificate courses.

Applications must be received by the following deadline in order to be considered for the respective semester:

Spring – October 15 Summer – March 15 Fall – June 15
